Introduction

The guidelines that follow are for students planning to apply for the Interdisciplinary Program for Biomedical Sciences (IPBS), Osaka University, on the recommendation of one of IPBS's designated partner institutions overseas. Please read the "IPBS Admission Policy" carefully in addition to these guidelines and make sure that you understand the IPBS overview, course objectives, and required attributes.

All international students nominated and successfully admitted to IPBS through recommendations will be affiliated with the Graduate School of Medicine, Osaka University. Students will earn credits given at the Graduate School of Medicine as well as courses specially offered for IPBS students. When students meet all course and other requirements, they will be awarded the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Medical Science.

1. Eligibility for application

To be eligible to apply under these guidelines, you must be a non-Japanese national residing outside Japan, who is recommended for admission to the IPBS by National Taiwan University, Mahidol University, Pohang University of Science and Technology, or Translational Health Science and Technology Institute in recognition of your distinguished academic record and potential to benefit significantly from participating in IPBS.

In addition, you must meet one of the following conditions.

- 1. You have completed (or expect to complete by September 30, 2013) 18 years of education with a final degree from a 6-year degree course in Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Science or Pharmaceutical Science.
 - **If the final degree is from a 6-year degree course in Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Science or Pharmaceutical Science, the total number of years of education may be less than 18.
- 2. You have completed (or expect to complete by September 30, 2013) a master's degree or equivalent.
 - *IPBS is created under the auspices of the Japanese government as part of its "Program for Leading Graduate Schools". You cannot enroll in more than one Leading Graduate Schools program.

2. Screening process

There will be two stages to the screening process and you will be notified of the result at each stage.

Stage 1

The local selection committee at your home university or institution will conduct the first screening process based on the application materials you have submitted.

Note that application documents must reach the local selection committee by Fall 2012. For the exact application deadline, please contact the local selection committee.

Stage 2

You will be interviewed by IPBS faculty members from Osaka University in the country where your home university is located. Interviews will be carried out from February 2013 to April 2013.

3. Choosing a supervisor (laboratory)

- IPBS students will conduct supervised research in innovative fields of biomedical sciences by formally affiliating with a particular laboratory in Graduate School of Medicine. As your laboratory affiliation is likely to determine your future research field and theme of study, please make sure that you consult with a prospective supervisor, preferably prior to the submission of your application.

 - (b) Contact the principal investigator of the laboratory of your choice (by email) with information such as your academic background, a research plan, and potential dissertation topics of interest (information required is likely to vary depending on the laboratory). Please make sure to inform him or her that you wish to apply for the IPBS by the recommendation of your home institution.

4. Application materials

Documents to be submitted;

- a) Application Form and Personal Statement
- b) Letter(s) of recommendation
- c) All academic transcripts from study above high school level
- d) A copy of your official TOEFL or IELTS score

*Please supply all documents in English.

a) Application Form and Personal Statement

Download and complete the Application Form from IPBS website. The file is in a Microsoft Excel format.

After filling in the application form, print it out, add your photograph and signature.

*Page 3: Supervisor (Laboratory) choices

If you have already obtained consent from a potential supervisor at Osaka University at the time of application, please write down the name of your potential supervisor and his or her research field as your **first** choice on the application form (leave the second and third choices blank.).

If you are unsure about the laboratory options and have not yet received consent from a prospective supervisor, you should indicate specific projects of your interest in your personal statement on page 4. Please provide the names of prospective supervisors of your **first**, **second**, and **third** choice and their research fields.

b) Letter(s) of recommendation

Under "References" on page 3 of the Application Form, please provide the names and contact details of two persons who are familiar with your academic credentials. In addition, please provide at least one letter of recommendation written in English by someone other than the two persons mentioned under "References" on page 3.

The letter of recommendation must include the following information:

- ✓ Name, current position and current institution of the referee;
- ✓ Name of applicant;
- ✓ Relation to the applicant;
- ✓ Judgement on the applicant's qualifications, academic records and skills that are relevant to the IPBS program and which indicate the preparedness and likelihood of the applicant to successfully complete challenging demands of a doctoral program such as IPBS. The referee may also wish to comment on the applicant's other attributes such as inter-personal, inter-cultural and communication skills, reasoning

and problem-solving skills, leadership ability, flexibility and creativity.

The letter of recommendation must be forwarded to the local selection committee in a sealed envelope with the referee's signature on the back of the envelope over the seal.

c) Academic transcript

If your transcripts are not in English, provide official independent translations bearing the stamp or signature of the translator as well as the original documents.

d) A copy of your official TOEFL or IELTS score

If English is not your first language and if your previous or current degree has not been taught entirely in English, you are required to provide evidence of your English language ability by submitting a copy of your score on either the TOEFL or the IELTS exam.

Applicants are expected to have minimum English language proficiency of TOEFL 550 PBT (79-80 iBT) or IELTS 6.0 to apply to the Graduate School of Medicine, but to be considered for IPBS admission a higher score is strongly recommended, such as 600 on the TOEFL PBT (100 iBT) or IELTS 6.5.

5. Notification of final result

You will be informed of the final outcome of your application in April 2013. If you have been admitted to the IPBS you will then be instructed about official enrollment procedures at the Graduate School of Medicine, Osaka University.

6. Important notes for application

- Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Changes to the application after submission will not be allowed.
- No submitted documents will be returned. Please retain photocopies of all original documents for your own records.
- Applicants who provided false information on their application will not enroll
 or will be expelled if they have already been enrolled.

All forms of communication including the screening results will take place

through the local selection committee of your institution.

7. Handling of personal information

1. Names, addresses and other personal information provided in the application form

and documents for submission will only be used for administrative purposes. For

enrolled students, this information will be used for academic and student

support-related matters.

2. Personal information may be used for monitoring the selection process and for

statistical purposes.

3. In any case that the above-mentioned tasks are outsourced to a third party, we will

enter into a contract with the third party for the custody of that personal information.
